

Contributing to the development of sustainable aquaculture by identifying bottlenecks, needs and research priorities

Recommending the EU, International and National research funding bodies on research priorities

Promoting research collaboration and knowledge transfer between research and industry sectors and between North, East and South MED countries

Create a **Mediterranean multi-stakeholder platform** based on existing networks and involving research institutes & academics, industry, policy makers, consumers, NGO's, etc.





- Providing Research priorities as a basis for:

 - Plan of Action for Research (POA)
- Implementation of Aquamed recommendation by EU and National policies
- Scientific\research collaboration projects
 (1 proposal of 5 countries was recently submitted)







Institutions involved in aquaculture research \quad \text{?} National contact points






Research institutes involved in aquaculture research






Research topic distribution

(MED level, during last 5 years)





A – Proposed concept: The Aquamed MSHP could serve as a Tool for the CAQ helping to:

- Assist in monitoring research progress towards sustainable production and updating research priorities
