Priority axis 4: sustainable development of fisheries areas

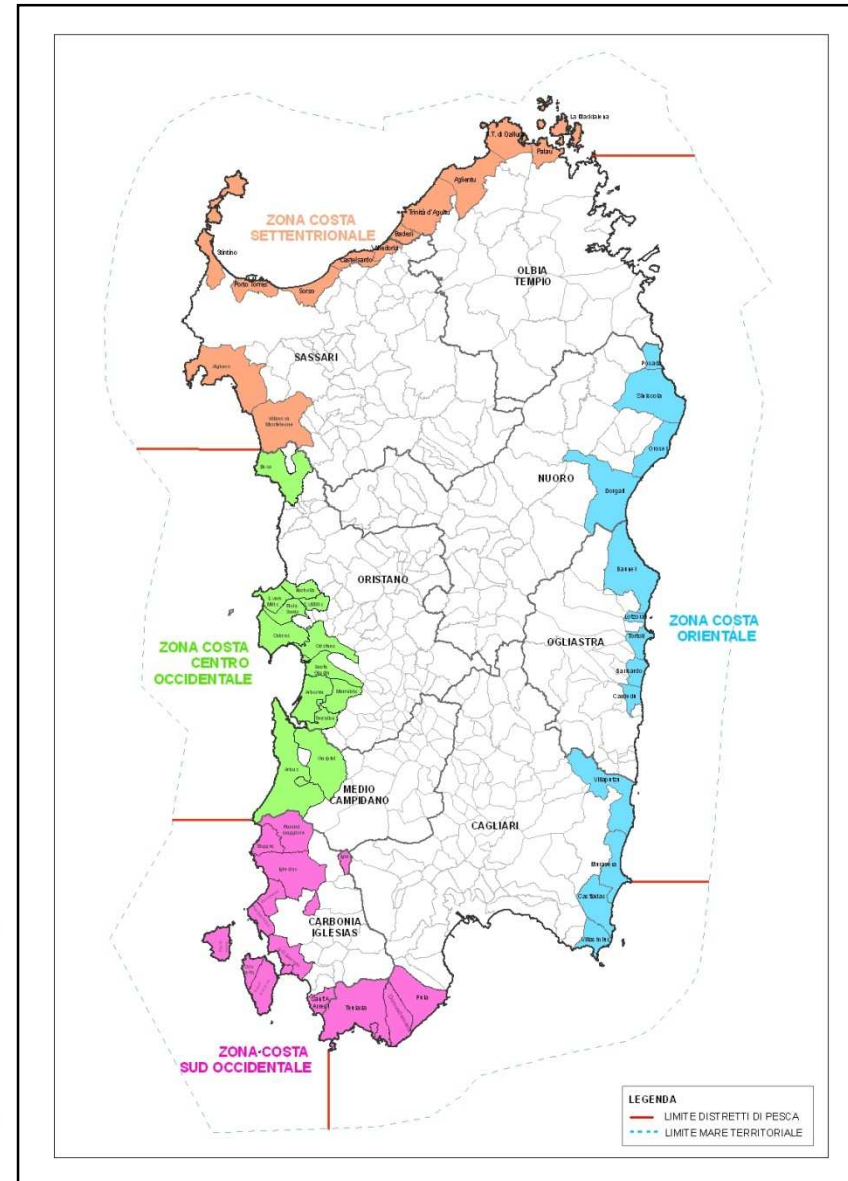
The Priority Axis 4 of the European Fisheries Fund (EFF) provides support for the sustainable development of fisheries areas. In particular, it supports measures to promote economic diversification (tourism, food, renewable energy..) and an improved quality of life in areas affected by a decline in fishing activities.

What is different about Axis 4

- ▶ In traditional approaches the menu is distributed among different interests according to need or influence (territoire guichet)
- ▶ In Axis 4 for Sustainable Development for the measures are used as a lever to build alliances around issues of common interest, to forge new responses to the long term challenges facing fishing areas.

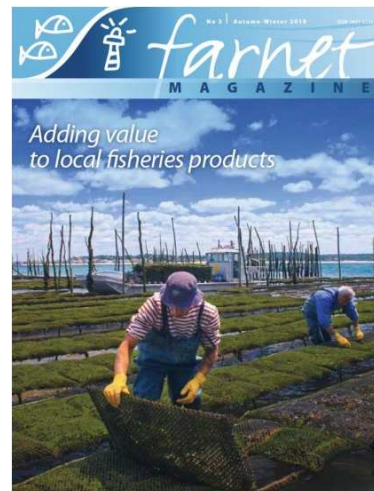

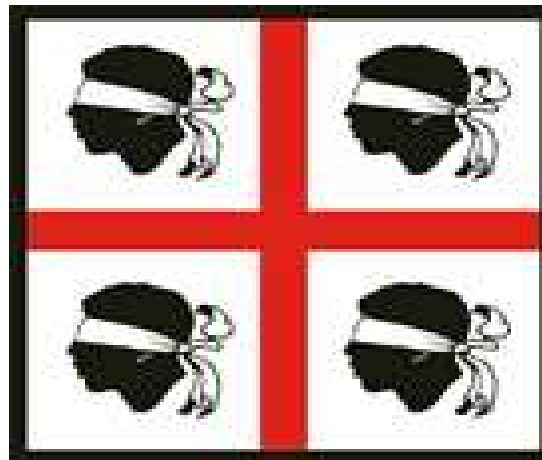

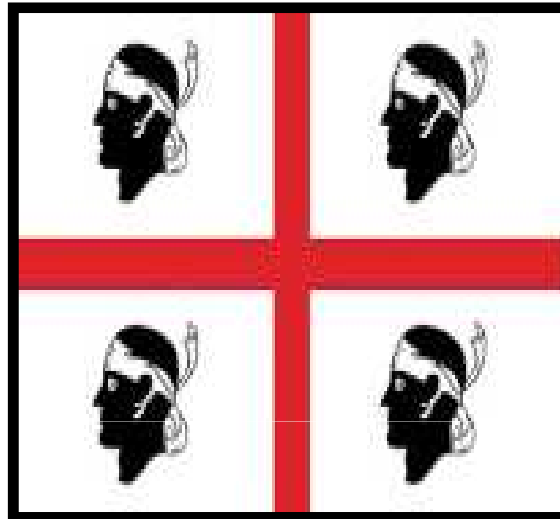

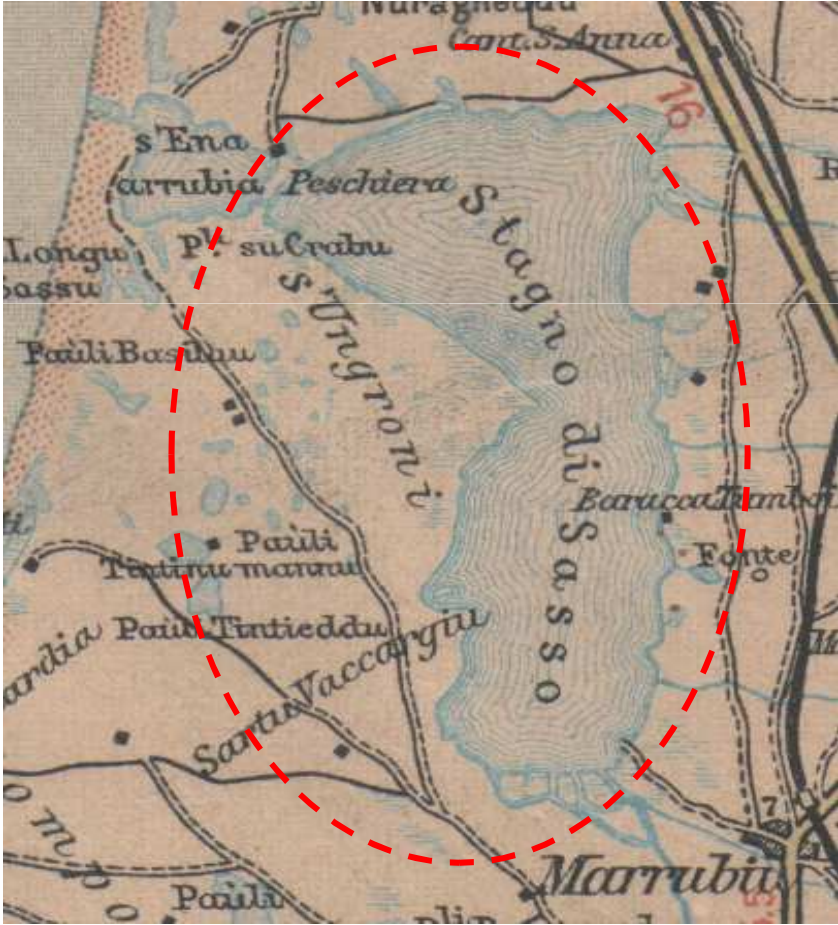

Public works carried out in order to recover lands for agriculture caused the disappear of Sasso lagoon.

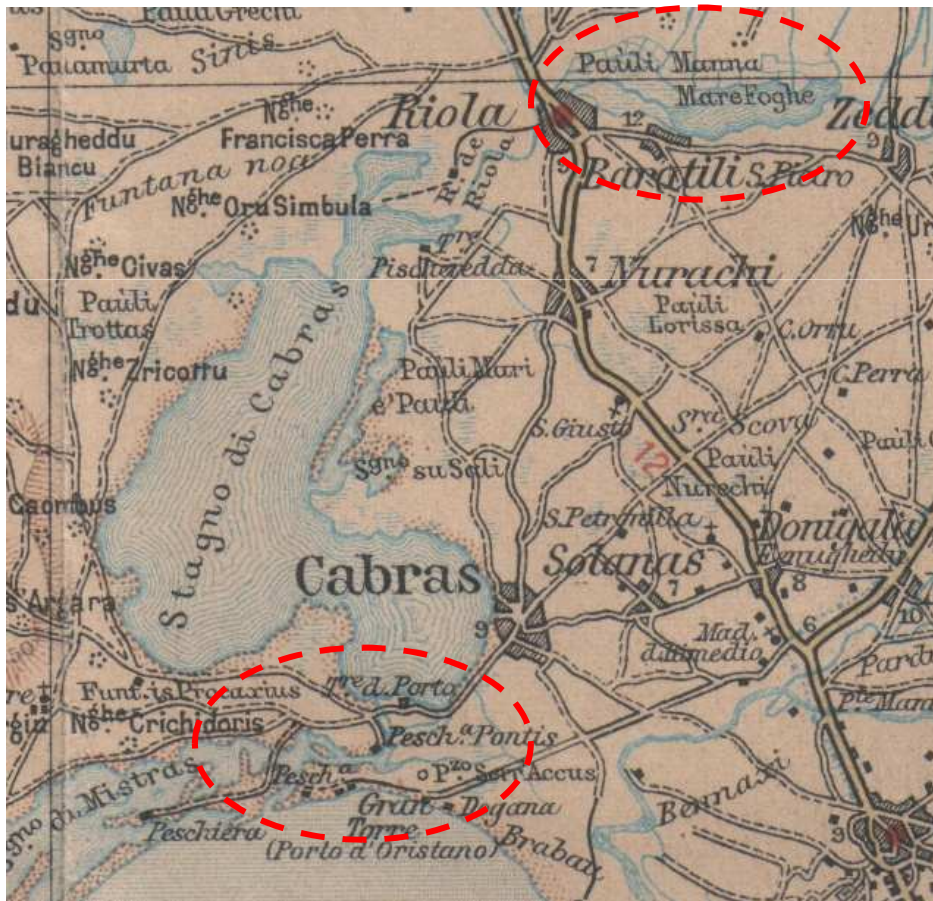

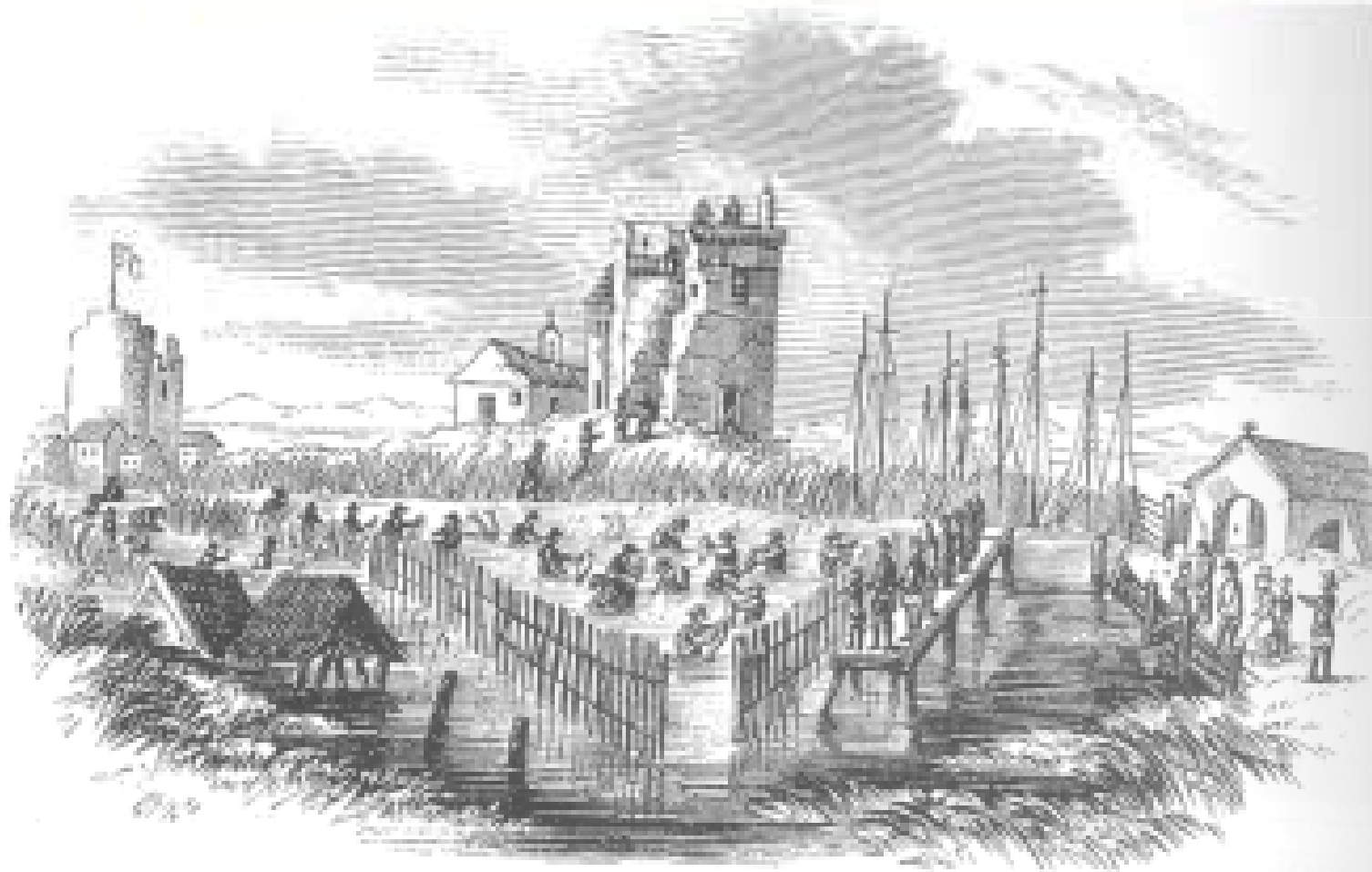

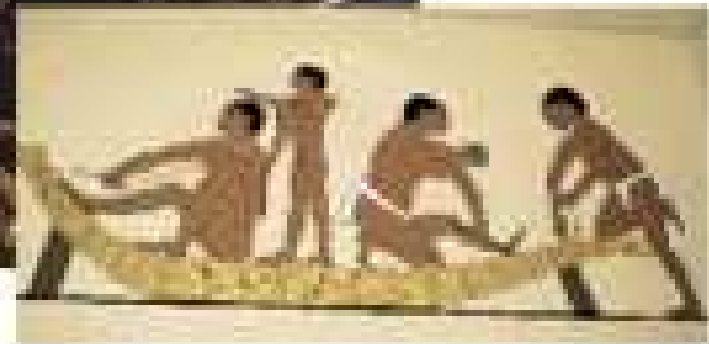

- Improve managerial approach

- Strengthen diversification activities
