Main objective

SHoCMed: "Developing siting and carrying capacity guidelines for Mediterranean aquaculture within aquaculture appropriate areas GFCM/CAQ" is a project in support to the activities of the GFCM Committee on Aquaculture (CAQ)) which is co-funded by European Commission DG-MARE. The SHoCMed project aims to produce criteria for enhancing the integration of aquaculture into coastal zone management by improving site selection and holding capacity and identifying environmental quality standards and reference points

The aim of this workshop is to present and discuss on the main issues related to spatial planning and coastal allocation zones for aquaculture activities within the GFCM region.

In particular the workshop has been assigned the following objectives:

- > Review and make synthesis of Mediterranean experience on spatial planning and allocated zones for aquaculture
- > Review technical and different legal procedures applied for aquaculture spatial planning and AZA within the different coastal areas;
- > Consider the different formats and experiences on GIS techniques for developing and monitoring planning aquaculture activities in coastal areas;
- > Discuss and make synthesis on the main aspects related to Allocated Zones for Aquaculture and to agree on a definition of Allocation Zones Aquaculture to be applied within the Mediterranean area and in an ecosystem perspective
- > Identify priorities and the key elements for the improvement of spatial planning for aquaculture and guidelines on AZA in the Mediterranean;
- > Present the main activities of the second year of SHoCMed;

Workshop aim features:

Participation is open to experts and different stakeholders linked to the aquaculture issues in the GFCM member countries. A number of experts will be invited in their individual capacity from a range of disciplines presenting national and local case studies on spatial planning and Allocation Zones for Aquaculture. Active participation from attendees and their inputs on the issues covered are crucial to ensure a successful workshop.

The outputs of the workshop will serve as basic contribution for the production of criteria and related guidelines for aquaculture site selection in the GFCM region within the activities of CAQ-WGSC (SHoCMed Project).
