




# **GFCM** Institutional Framework

- 1949 Constitutive Agreement under Article XIV of the FAO Constitution
  - Competence over the Black Sea, the Mediterranean Sea and connecting waters
  - Mandate over fisheries and aquaculture
- 24 Members (3 Black Sea States, 19 Mediterranean States, 1DWFN, 1 REIO) and 3 Cooperating Countries (Georgia, Russian Federation, Ukraine)
- Goal: Ensure the long-term sustainability of living marine resources, the sustainable development of marine and brackish water aquaculture and the protection of sensitive habitats
- 2011: Task Force was established to modernize GFCM

## Structure of the GFCM




# A strategic framework to boost sub-regional cooperation, including in the Black Sea


- The first GFCM Framework Programme was conceived as a tool to make GFCM more functional, consistent with the objectives of the Task Force, through:
- 1. Improving Governance and Management in the Black and Mediterranean Sea through integrated maritime approach
- 2. Strengthening the capacity of national institutions in the field of data collection and supporting the establishment of regional databases and information systems
- 3. Promoting the role of Aquaculture for food security and economic growth
- 4. Enhancing the development of Artisanal Fisheries/Assessing the status of Recreational Fisheries
- 5. Supporting institutional and technical cooperation in the Southern Mediterranean and in the Black Sea

#### A Sub-Regional Approach for long-term management plans in the Black Sea and the Mediterranean Sea

- Science behind future policy moves
- Bridge data gaps for fish stocks to further a multispecies based approach
- No one-size-fits-all fisheries regulations for an area as diverse as that of the GFCM, including the Black Sea
- Long term management plans to phase out by-catch of endangered species and discards of non target species
- Guidelines adopted at the 36<sup>th</sup> Session of the Commission last May as reference point
- Grant Agreement with the EU to launch work in 2013 on the strengthening of data collection systems and the implementation of long-term management plans
