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Expert Meeting on Fisheries Legislation in the Mediterranean and the Black Sea

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Overview of the fisheries legal framework

The basic regulations that include biological resource management, i.e., fishing, farming and protection of fish and other organisms in the sea on the principles of sustainable development, is the Law on Marine Fishery and Mariculture.

The Law on Marine Fishery and Mariculture provides a basic legal framework, which is partly harmonized with the secondary legal sources of the EU and Regulations of GFCM.

- ➤ Secundary legislation have being prepared, by the end of 2012
- ➤ Amendments on the Law are planned in 2012, in order to timely implement the regulations of GFCM
- > Engaged a legal expert from the EU, through the IPA 2009

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Access regimes to fisheries resources

The Law on Marine Fishery and Mariculture also regulates the issues related to determination of conditions for fishing activities, which may be:

- >commercial,
- ➤sports-recreational and
- ➤ fishing for scientific-research purposes.

Based on the fishing capacity and the significance of the commercial fishing (the species and commercial value of fish and other marine organisms), the commercial fishing is classified into the following:

- ➤ large-scale commercial fishing, and
- ➤ small-scale commercial fishing

and may be carried out only with a fishing permit.

Monitoring, control and surveillance measures

In accordance with the Law Monitoring, control and surveillance are implemented by:

- Fishery unit Ministry of Agriculture and rural Development
- ➤ Institute of marine Biology
- > Fishery Inspectors
- Border Police

Development of the Fisheries Information System continued through the IPA 2009 project "Sustainable management of marine fisheries.

Also, it is planned that by mid 2012 through the project, establish a VMS, eelectronic logbook for vessels over 12 LOA, buying scientific research vessel for Instutute of Marine Biology in order to provide better supervision and control of fish stocks and fishing activities.
