

#### What are NALOs?


- Online collection of legislative country reviews

  - Scope: from set up to distribution





# **Background**

- Aquaculture is a fast growing food sector (SOFIA 2010 Statistics)
- In the Mediterranean, aquaculture plays an important role in increasing the production of fisheries products (GFCM 34<sup>th</sup> session)
- Sub-Committee on Aquaculture (last COFI/AQ in October 2010) (last GFCM/CAQ in March 2011)
- Need for accessible & reliable aquaculture info (NASO, Cultured Species, Glossary)



- Online and offline research (FAOLEX, Web, Library)
- Identification of applicable legislation
- Support of relevant literature
- Validation by national authorities or experts



### **Publication process**

#### Coordination by FIRA

Drafting and research by **Legal consultants Supervision** by LEGN

Validation by national authority or expert

**Translation** into 6 FAO languages (according to the availability of funds)

Formatting and online publication by FIGIS

**Updating** each 2 or 3 years





- Comparative study based on NALOs (best practices)
- Regular update needed every 2 to 3 years
- Provide more translations
- Similar template could be adapted to capture fisheries
- Options to enhance the NALO collection:
  - Additional country reviews (enlarge database)
  - Monitoring the implementation of int'l instruments, e.g.
     Code of Conduct (expand scope)
- Collaboration with other FAO Departments/Organizations
