






Adriatic Fishery Statistics and Information Systems




- Ichtyoplankton survey in the Libyan waters (Gulf of Sirt, July 2010)



- Cooperation between national institutions from Spain, Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia facilitating the experts participation in a training course on acoustics


Strengthening regional cooperation

- Catch assessment implemented in North Lebanon should be extended to the southern region






