

What is the value added of the 'new' guidelines?




The important role of small-scale fisheries is not fully recognised.

- Marginalisation and deficient access to resources
- Exclusion from policy and decision-making processes
- Poverty and high levels of vulnerability

BUT: momentum to obtain a negotiated international instrument

- Active role of civil society
- Consolidation and transmission of accumulated knowledge
- Implementation in parallel with guideline development process

By providing advice and recommendations, establishing principles and criteria to assist States, local governments and stakeholders in attaining the vision ¹ FAO's Advisory Committee on Fishery Research Working Group on Small-Scale Fisheries

The importance of process Consultations build upon each other Involve all relevant stakeholders Allow sufficient time for effective consultations Development overlaps with implementation Negotiated instrument agreed by governments, regional organizations and CSOs owned by small-scale fishing communities


