








The Black Sea context

- Limited number of commercially important stocks shared by several countries with a main operator (Turkey, around 80 %)
- Anoxia conditions below 150 m (> 80 % waters), limit fisheries to shelf area
 - Absence of global international coordination of the exploitation of fishery resources in the region
