## **CIRCULAR LETTER**

## <u>Subject</u>: Announcement of the first meeting of the GFCM Working Group on the Black Sea. Constanta (Romania), 16-18 January 2012

At its 13<sup>th</sup> Session held in Marseille in February 2011, the GFCM Scientific Advisory Committee called the attention on the need to start specific actions to be included in the short-term work plan with the aim to improve the knowledge of the fisheries in the Black Sea area and to strengthen their management. Upon this proposal, the annual meeting of the GFCM Commission in May 2011 decided to set up a Working Group to facilitate the work of the SAC in delivering fishery management advice for the Black Sea and to promote the regional cooperation in the field of fisheries and environmental issues.

In this context, the GFCM is pleased to confirm that the *First meeting of the GFCM Working Group* on the Black Sea will be held from 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> January 2012, kindly hosted by the National Institute for Marine Research and Development "Grigore Antipa" (NIMRD), in Constanta (Romania).

This meeting is open to all experts and managers of the Black Sea riparian countries (namely: Bulgaria, Georgia, Romania, Russian Federation, Turkey and Ukraine) as well as Organizations and initiatives sharing the same interests and objectives in the Black Sea.
